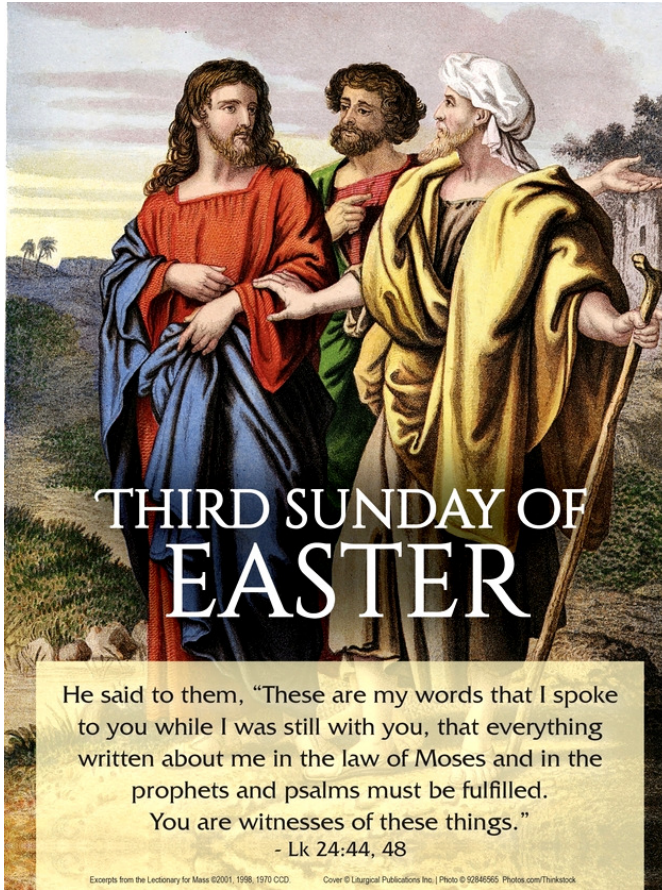

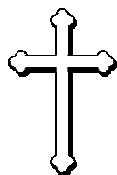

Dearlly Beloved Parishioners,

Archbishop Vigneron tells us, “To become an effective evangelizer one must first be evangelized, since we cannot give away what we do not have (*Unleash the Gospel*, Guidepost 4).” What does this mean, to “be evangelized”? It means to be encounter the person of Christ and to commit one’s life to him. The Church is in need of continual evangelization, continual renewal, continual conversion, and this can only come as a consequence of encountering the Risen Lord Jesus. In Today’s Gospel (Luke 24:35-48), the disciples have an encounter with the Risen Lord that will forever change their lives. In the aftermath of the crucifixion, they are scared, disillusioned, and ridden with grief. All their hope died with Jesus on that Cross. In the midst of their pain and suffering, they encounter the Risen Lord Jesus and everything changes. It is the encounter with Christ that transforms the disciples from mourners into evangelizers. They become witnesses to the resurrection of Jesus Christ. In the first reading, Peter says, “The author of life you put to death, but God raised him from the dead; of this we are witnesses (Acts 3:13-15, 17-19).” Peter, who locked himself in the upper-room for fear of the Jewish authorities was transformed from a wimp into a witness, and ultimately he was willing to die for his testimony to Jesus. As individuals, as the Church in Detroit and the world, we are called to undergo a similar missionary conversion; we are called to encounter the Risen Lord, and become transformed into witnesses to the truth of the Gospel. Have I had a life-changing encounter with the Lord Jesus? Have I experienced the power of the Resurrection of Jesus in my own life? Am I convinced of the difference it makes in my life to know Jesus? We cannot give away what we do not have, so we need to ask constantly, “Come, Lord Jesus, and show me that you are real. Grant me the grace of knowing you.”

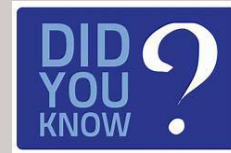

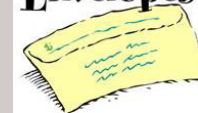

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

The themes linked in today’s Scripture readings call for us to avoid sin by following the Lord’s directives, to repent, and to seek forgiveness. St. Peter, in the Acts of the Apostles, relates the evil of Christ’s passion and death, and that through repentance and conversion, *our sins be wiped away*. St. John, in his First Letter, reminds us that Jesus is an offering for our sins. In St. Luke’s Gospel, Jesus appears to His disciples after His Resurrection while two of them recount their encounter with Jesus on the road to Emmaus. They finally recognize Him in the breaking of the bread. The Church has long taught that partaking of the Eucharist forgives lesser sins. Likewise, participating in the sacrament of Reconciliation for the forgiveness of sins opens us to Christ’s grace, bringing us closer to Him, giving us peace in our lives. This week, go to confession and receive Holy Communion to draw into union with Christ
