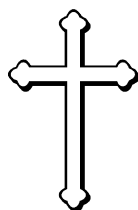
REFLECTING ON GOD’S WORD

Often we are unable to identify the truth in our lives. Is our passion love or lust? Is our financial security greed or wise preparation? Is the raising of our children good discipline or carving them into our own image and likeness? Is our religiosity superstition or faithfulness to the tradition? Do our dreams nurture the Kingdom of God or the Tower of Babel? In other words, is it from God or is it from the Other Side? So we look about us, and because our neighbors’ lives seem little different from our own, we put into any self-help harbor that seems able to shelter us from aimless drifting.

Most of us, I suspect, wonder if there is anyone who knows the deepest truths, whether they be about life or about our world or even about ourselves. So we find ourselves gathering about Jesus, though even then some may do so half-heartedly—at times trusting that he will have some sort of answer and at other times wondering if he indeed does, yet not knowing where else to go. And so we gather, like sheep around a shepherd, simply because every other voice has been heard and found wanting.

CARDINAL DEARDEN MEMORIAL

You are invited to a prayer service in memory of John Cardinal Dearden on Wed., Aug. 1st from 7 to 9 pm at St. Therese of Lisieux Parish. This memorial marks the 30th anniversary of his passing and is sponsored by the Cardinal Dearden Legacy Project. The cardinal served the Church with great distinction at the Second Vatican Council and as our archbishop from 1958 to 1980. He invited Catholics to grow a vibrant Church through adult education and restructured the archdiocese to engage us in building the Kingdom of God. THE LITURGY OF THE DAY

“The Lord is my shepherd,” we sing today, and rich is Psalm 23 in describing what the LORD does for us. The LORD refreshes our souls, guides us to the right way, furnishes comfort and safety in difficult times, gives us sustenance to overflowing, and promises a dwelling place forever. Truly, the LORD provides all that we need.

Our readings today reveal and confirm God’s desire to shepherd us: to care for, protect, and comfort us as shepherds tend their sheep.- In the first reading, God promises to provide shepherds for the people, particularly a descendant of David who will rule wisely and justly. In the Gospel, Jesus, Son of David, is moved with pity when people flock to him, comparing them to sheep without a shepherd. With these passages in mind, we are able to sing in the psalm, “The Lord is my shepherd, there is nothing I shall want.”

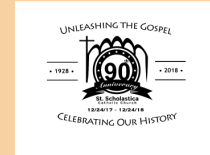

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

Today’s Scripture readings present the theme of the Good Shepherd. The prophet Jeremiah warns those shepherds who mislead and scatter the flock that their evil deeds will not go unpunished. He prophesies about Jesus, the Good Shepherd, Who God will lift up as a righteous shoot from David’s line. St. Paul reminds us how, through Christ, we are brought together in Him. In St. Mark’s Gospel, Jesus shows compassion by taking pity on the crowd, the lost sheep, and begins to instruct them. How can we seek a deeper relationship with Christ, the Good Shepherd? Do we, in the spirit of evangelization, encourage with love our brothers and sisters who have left the faith to reopen their hearts to Jesus — to allow Him personally into their lives? Begin by asking them to attend Alpha or another evangelization series at your parish.

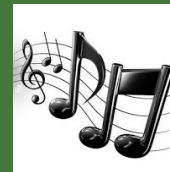
